


Responsive mode

EUROCORES - Main Features

- Multi-national research projects (research groups from at least 3 different participating countries)
- International competition

EUROCORES Programme

European Collaborative Research

- Funding remains national
- ESF ensures quality control
- Provides flexible framework for collaboration of national funding agencies
- Investigator driven

A Eurocores programme typically involves

- 10-20 participating countries
- a research budget of 5-12 M€
- a running time of 3 years





EUROCORES - Where are we now?

- Ca. 200 programme proposals submitted
- Ca. 40 programmes selected

EUROCORES Programme European Collaborative Research

- Ca. 8.000 applications of Collaborative Research teams (CRPs)
- Ca. 200 M€ funding
- Ca. 70 funding organisations from ca. 35 countries, within and outside Europe

The overall aim of the EuroBABEL programme is to promote empirical research on underdescribed endangered languages that aims at changing and refining our ideas about linguistic structure in general and about language in relation to cognition, social and cultural organization in a trans-/ multidisciplinary perspective.
