

Background of the ESF MO Forum: ESF/Eurohorcs Road Map 2009

- 1. strengthen the **relations** between **science**, **society** and the private sector
- 2. promote European research careers
- 3. develop scientific foresight for joint strategy
- 4. create a European Grant Union
- address peer review of proposals
- develop common approaches to <u>ex-post</u> evaluation
- 7. create ERA Connect and Regional Clusters of Excellence
- 8. develop shared funding and exploitation of research infrastructure
- 9. implement common policy on Open Access
- 10. connect European research to the world





General Aims and Objectives of the Forum on Evaluation of Publicly Funded Research

► Aims

- To improve evaluation studies on funding schemes
- To learn about best practices of impact assessment of research and research fund
- To identify the challenges in conducting transnational comparative evaluation

Objectives

- To facilitate networking
- To exchange and share information on evaluation studies of funding schemes and practices
- To produce an inventory of current and past impact evaluation practices/methodologies across
 Member Organisations, identifying gaps and lessons learned
- To develop an analysis of research portfolios and research output

▶ builds on the work of the former Forum (2007-2009)

- 6 Observers (e.g. EC, ERC, Wellcome Trust)

▶ Organisation


- Five Forum meetings (plenary session, working group meetings)

Fields of activities of the Working Groups

▶ WG 1. Quality assurance and Evaluation Guidelines

- Draw up guidelines for ex-post evaluation of funding schemes
- Do a survey among the members on evaluation organisation and practices
- Develop a website repository containing evaluation reports and guidelines

► WG 2. Impact assessment on Science and Society

- Discuss the advantages and shortcomings with different methods for impact assessment
- Try to identify good practices in order to avoid pitfalls
- Conduct an in-depth analysis of impact studies

▶ WG 3. Classification systems and Categorisation of output data

- Examine feasibility of common systems to classify research portfolios
- Approaches for the collection and analysis of output data



Expected Outcome

▶ WG 1. Quality assurance and Evaluation Guidelines

- Collection of evaluation studies and links to MO's evaluation activities
- Description of Evaluation practices and Recommendations ("Golden Rules")

▶ WG 2. Impact assessment on Science and Society

- report with in depth-analysis of practices of impact assessment
- potential for joint project

▶ WG 3. Classification systems and Categorisation of output data

- short paper on the classification of research portfolios
- short paper summarising approaches for the analysis of output data
- recommended approaches, "core" set of outputs + guidance on definitions
- potential for pilot exercise

Report on overarching topics, (policy) recommendations, outlook
