It is also important to note that some who would otherwise have been reluctant to record their stories were willing when given the possibility of seeing the outcome.

Tatiana Bulgakova published a school text book, *Nanay literature*, which includes information on the religious praxis of Nanay people, and helps return the almost forgotten traditional values back to the people, very few of whom now remember the traditional way of life.
