What is SERNNNoCa

- A new network of researchers and community organizations, funded by the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, that aims to study the role that the social economy can play in the sustainable development of Northern Canada
- It is built around the three Northern Territorial Colleges and their respective research institutions and links researchers working in the North with Northern students, community organizations, and educational institutions
- Funding is \$1.75 million over 5 years – the largest social science research project ever funded in Northern Canada
- Network covers Yukon, NWT, Nunavut, Nunavik, and Labrador
