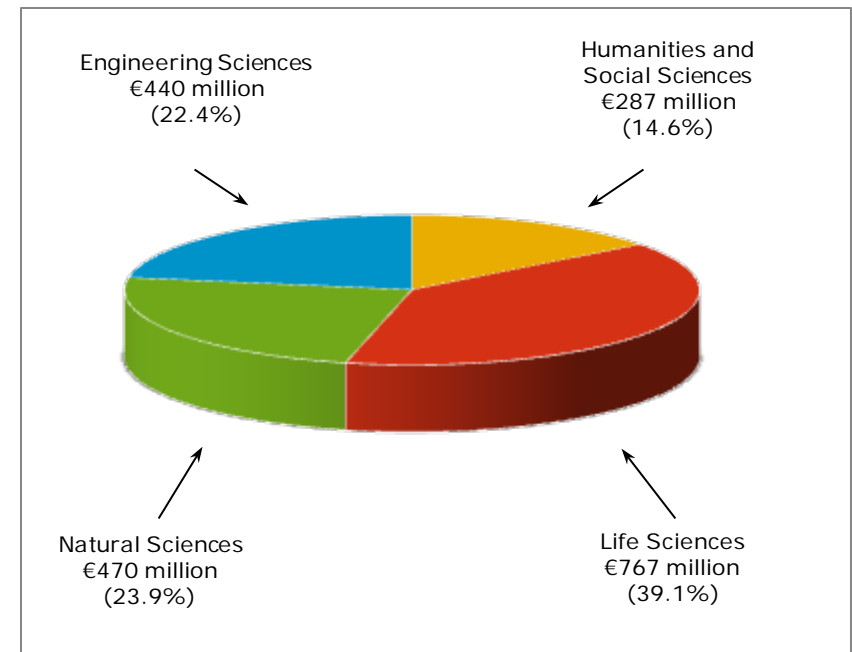
0 - DFG's mission Statement

Germany's biggest & independent funding agency

The DFG

- ▶ serves **all branches of science and the humanities**
- ▶ fosters **scientific excellence** through competition
- ▶ supports **international cooperation in research**
- ▶ **advises** political and social decision-makers
- ▶ supports the **transfer of knowledge** between science and industry

1 - LogICCC funding by DFG

some facts

- ▶ February 26, 2007: DFG announces participation in LogICCC with **up to 10 projects and up to 3 million Euros**
- ▶ November 8-9, 2007: review panel meeting
- ▶ June 5, 2008: formal funding decision by DFG:
 - total funding volume 2,714,597 Euros (for 36 months)
 - for 9 German PIs
- ▶ EUROCORES were considered a European equivalent of DFG's priority programmes, i. e. unite excellent scientists in an emerging field to make joint progress

2 - DFG and Europe

DFG's relationship with the European players

- ▶ DFG supports the merger of European Science Foundation (ESF) and Heads of European Research Councils (EuroHORCS) to **Science Europe** as a framework for cooperation of funding agencies in Europe
- ▶ DFG appreciates the efforts of the **European Research Council** to establish highly attractive programmes which are open to all fields of science and evaluated exclusively according to scientific criteria
- ▶ DFG and some German partners (e.g., Max Planck society) have a **joint office in Brussels** to keep in touch with the European Commission and other organisations
- ▶ DFG cooperates with many European partners through **bi- and multilateral** agreements (FWF, SNF, FNR, NWO, ANR, ESRC, ...)

3 - Follow-up Funding

opportunities for LogICCC participants at German universities

- ▶ DFG's individual grants programme („Einzelverfahren“) is available for continuing the work started within LogICCC
- ▶ funding for joint projects with partners from Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Luxembourg may be obtained through the Lead-Agency scheme:
 - a single proposal is submitted to two (or more) of the partner organisations DFG (DE), FWF (AT), SNF (CH), FNR (LU) for separate eligibility checking
 - the lead agency is responsible for the review procedure
 - a common funding decision is made based on the review results
- ▶ DFG also provides (co-)funding for international conferences and bilateral workshops
