


The Bretherton diagram (1986)




Visions

- 1864: *"The earth is fast becoming an unfit home for its noblest inhabitants"* (George Perkins Marsh)
- 1984: *"It is man's earth now. One wonders what obligations may accompany this infinite possession"*
(Fairfield Osborn)
- 2011: *A general sense that humans are faced with a narrowing window of opportunity; if we do not act very soon it will be too late.*
- Fundamental perceptual and political changes.

- A *The new “human condition”.*
- B *The cultures and histories of landscape.*
- C *Values, justice, and behaviour.*
- D *Governance, science, democracy, trust; Climategate.*
- E *Predicting futures.*

Recommendations & Roadmap

- A A massive collaborative research effort.
- B Given the central role of human activity, it is vitally important to study human behaviour, social arrangements, and human-environmental interactions on a much grander scale than ever before.
- C A radical effort to redress the balance and to multiply funding for the social sciences and the humanities.
- D New interdisciplinary institutions on the European and the global level.
