Scientific Report of 1st visit through EURO-XPRAG travel grant no 3811

During the first visit of Assimakopoulos to Cardiff, he was familiarised with the experimental paradigm utilised and with Tomlinson and Bott designed and ran an initial experiment on the proposed topic. In more detail, we finalised two lists of natural data (see attached), one for narrowing and one for metaphor, with 40 triples of sentences (a pragmatically enriched, a literal and a nonsensical version) and designed an experiment based on the mousetracking paradigm. We also prepared some sentences on approximation and category extension, but due to the time limit we didn't include them in this experiment, but will utilise them later on. Regarding narrowing we incorporated in our examples 10 sentences from Rubio Fernandez (2008) in order to see whether we would replicate her results. With respect to metaphors, we chose our sentences on the basis of their conventionality (cf. Jones & Estes 2006) while trying to keep the context as minimal as possible making all sentences 9 words long. Then we ran the experiment carefully counterbalancing the sentences between 4 groups of 10 participants. In this respect, 20 were presented with half the enriched and half the figurative sentences and the other 20 were presented with the rest, while in each group of 20, half were presented with the 'Sense' option on the left of the screen and the 'Nonsense' one on the right and vice versa. We collected the data from 40 participants and now are in the process of analysing them via e-mail communication and videoconferencing. We also discussed our next steps and decided to conduct a second experiment replicating Rubio Fernandez's paradigm, but through the implimentation of pictures, setting the preparatory work that would need to be carried out before the second visit in 2011.
